What am I going to learn this year?

In 5th grade we learn a lot of new and exciting things. Here are some of the things we will be learning:

Math – Decimals, Fractions, 3×2 digit Multiplication and Division, Problem Solving, Standard and Metric Measures.

Science – Earth Systems, Properties and Changes in Matter, Cycling Matter in Earth Systems.

Social Studies – U.S. History which includes: Explorers, Colonization, Revolution, Constitution, Civil War, Industrial Revolution, World War I, and World War II.

Language Arts – Reading Comprehension, Spelling, Vocabulary, Writing Conventions.

WATER BOTTLES

Behavior Expectations

Students need to conduct themselves in a manner that contributes to a productive learning atmosphere for themselves and their classmates. Students are expected to be attentive, cooperative, respectful, and industrious while in the classroom. The following are rules guiding our classroom behavior:

1. Follow directions the first time given.
2. Keep hands, feet, objects to yourself.
3. Be in your seat (unless you have permission).
4. Talk only when appropriate. No shout outs.
5. Work when you should be working.
6. Cheer and uplift your peers.

PLANNERS

At the end of each school day, we will take time as a class to work on our organizational skills by keeping track of our assignments and homework on our Planner page. This will come back and forth from school to home each day in your child's homework folder. The students are required to show you what they have learned, and what work they still need to complete. Please take the time to go over this with them EVERYDAY and sign or initial that you have seen their planner. Planner pages are due on Thursday, or the last day of the school week.

Behavior Management Policy

Consequences for good behavior: verbal praise, self-respect, positive learning environment, positive notes/emails, fun activities, etc. I will be using a Clip-chart to manage behaviors. Good behaviors will be rewarded, while bad behaviors will be disciplined as follows.

Consequences for disruptive behavior:

Step 1:	Warning
Step 2:	Miss 5 minutes of recess
Step 3:	Write the class rules 5 times
Step 4:	Think Time
Step 5:	Call Home OR Mystery Consequence
Step 6:	Sent to the office ☹️

Serious Clause: Students will be sent directly to the office for any type of physical aggression (fighting), verbal aggression (bullying, harassment), or severe non-compliance.

BIRTHDAY TREATS/SNACKS

If you would like to provide a treat for your child's birthday, it must be individually wrapped. Please do not send treats such as donuts or cupcakes. Birthday treats will be sent home at the end of the day.

Late/Missing Work

Students are required to complete in-class/homework assignments and turn them in on time.

Students who miss school are required to make up the work they missed. Your student will have 2 days after an absence to get their work completed before they are held responsible to get it turned in. Please let Mrs. Bailey know of any extenuating circumstances.

I will always have a list of **Missing Work** on whiteboards at the back of the room. Your child will know at all times what they are missing. If students have missing work, they will be required to stay in from part of recess to complete the work.
